International Bylaws changes

 The Pantograph List of Lodges book [the one you see on the Tyler's desk to check dues cards] is now the source book to determine if a visiting Foreign Blue Lodge Member is from a recognized Grand Lodge/Blue Lodge and will be used for inquiries for starting a club in foreign jurisdictions.

- To become a High Twelvian has now changed from Master Mason to MASON in the International and Uniform Club Bylaws. This will allow EA's & FC's that carry a dues card, that shows their highest degree obtained, which indicates they paid their dues and can join any High Twelve Člub. This change originated from California where all EA's & FC's pay dues/and per- capita. They have several thousand EA's & FC's that are now eligible to join High Twelve in CA or any other state should they move and keep current in their dues. There are other Grand Lodge's that are/may consider doing the same thing, so we are positioned for the future now. So remember, any MASON showing a valid/current Dues Card as a Master Mason, Fellow Craft or Entered Apprentice can join your club TODAY, this has no impact with your local Grand Lodge whether or not they can join as the answer
- The Uniform Association Constitution and Bylaws were also adopted and all Associations are hereby directed to adopt them now!

The purpose of this Flag Day Ceremony was to honor our country's Flag and to celebrate the Anniversary of its birth, and to recall the achievements attained beneath its folds. It is quite appropriate that such a Service be held by all Masonic Orders; because one of the major values of all Masonic Bodies is **Patriotism**. It is to quicken that Spirit of Patriotism among its members that we hold this Flag Day Ceremony today. While the significance of the American Flag is manifold, we hold high four principles most dear to all, who hold this Flag closest to their hearts: Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity. By these four values we teach Love of Country and our Countrymen and Love of the American Way of Life, for which we are ready to die, if need be.

The evolution of the American Flag marks the progression of the Government of the American People. From the British founding of Jamestown in Virginia, in 1607, until 1775 the Union Jack, the flag of England, was the Flag of the peoples of America. Once independence was sought and finally won several Flags were flown by the aborning nation: The Pine Tree Flag, the Snake Flag, the Continental Colors or Grand Union Flag, the Stars and Stripes, the Ranger Flag, the Flag of 1818 and which is now affectionately known as Old Glory.



This is our Nation's Flag, which stands in its position of Honor to the left of our Club's Altar and stands with Pride and Love Enshrined in the Heart of Every Loyal Mason.

August 21st: Dave Coopman, will tell us about his new book, "Famous Moline People".


