The conflict was intensified by the ongoing Cold War between the United States and the Soviet Union. More than 3 million people (including over 58,000 Americans) were killed in the Vietnam War, and more than half of the dead were Vietnamese civilians. Opposition to the war in the United States bitterly divided Americans, even after President Richard Nixon ordered the withdrawal of U.S. forces in 1973.

Communist forces ended the war by seizing control of South Vietnam in 1975, and the country was unified as the Socialist Republic of Vietnam the following year.

After some (a lot) of discussion we will present the following for you to study and to have an opinion on for 2020.

The life membership will be offered to members of the President's Club.

You will automatically become a member of the President's Club along with your own Club.

Your Home Club will be exempt from paying Per-capita on your membership.

The cost will be \$300.00. This includes a \$50.00 donation to the Wolcott Fund. This is in line with KT, Grotto, and many other bodies, where a donation to the Charity is part of the deal. The fee represents 25 years dues for the President's Club plus the donation. It can be collected as a lump sum or paid out over a 12 month period at \$25.00 per month. See the next paragraph for further information.

If you wish, you can include your State per-capita and your Club Dues X 25 in your payment, and spread the total over two years, and you will be exempt from all dues in your home Club. So the International per-capita covers your home Club's percapita ligation. Should you wish to be a Life Member in another Club the same deal apposes, 25 times their total dues, Club, State, and International.

You will be supporting High Twelve as it moves into it's Second Century, hopefully with your Sons and Grandsons as Members.

You will be supporting The Wolcott Fund with a nice donation, and no doubt the savings in your Dues will encourage you to drop a few extra bob into the Little Red School House, at a meeting. Maybe the same as you tip your server, and be a good tipper my Brothers.

As I said a few months ago, the Trustees should be limited in their powers to collection of the Life fund payments as they come in, and follow up to be sure everyone stays current on their obligations, and to hire and fire the Professional Investment Counselors. There will be no Son/Brother-in-laws, pet banks, or buddies involved in this. Only 90% of the income can be used to pay out. In bad years we all share in the pain. In the exceptionally good years all will share in the bonus, including a rebate to the Life Member, if he is still with us, and wants it.

Yes, us older guys will probably not make a profit here, but we are going to insure that our beloved High Twelve will be here for a very long time. That is a pretty good incentive in itself. If you like what you see, and give it your approval in 2020, after the first and second reading at the Mid Term in January 2020, and at International in June 2020, I will be the first one to apply. Unless one of you beats me to the Secretary's desk.

If you can make it, Kansas is having their State Convention in Hutchinson on April 6th. See the website for details.

Just a reminder that if you have not mailed in your donation for the **2019 Label Program** please take a couple of minutes do so today, every dollar received helps! You can even donate online [here](#) (you don't need to have a PayPal account to use the service!).

With the recent rash of 'dubious' emails that went out recently to some members the decision has been made to "lock down" certain pages of the HTI website. These nefarious characters would take a name from the officer listings and create an email address and then send an email request to obtain various types of information. The thing to remember is if it doesn't sound right it probably isn't! If you have a question, call the member directly or email them with their real email address but do not click on reply to the bogus email.

The pages specifically locked are the association officer's pages and club meeting and officer pages. The HTI Officer page has only corporate email address available to the public and all phone numbers have been removed. To see the association and club officer information you MUST be logged into the website (upper right corner of any page). There is one requirement - there must be an email associated with your membership information. As I noted earlier there are only about 1/3 of the membership with known emails. You have a known address as you are receiving this Monthly Update directly. If this email is being forwarded to you or your club members those email

addresses need to be provided to the HTI Office at secretary@high12.org.

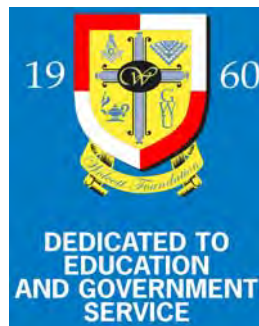

***Providing Graduate Level Fellowships at
George Washington University, Washington, DC***



WOLCOTT FOUNDATION AWARDS SIX (6) 2019 FELLOWSHIPS: The Board of Trustees of the Wolcott Foundation Inc. has awarded six (6) Wolcott Fellowships at George Washington University, in Washington, DC, for the Fall Semester of 2019. The Wolcott Foundation is the official philanthropy of High Twelve International Inc.

The Foundation Board of Trustees received 38 applications for the two year \$30,000.00 graduate level Fellowship for students attending the Elliott School of International Affairs, the Trachtenberg School of Public Policy and Public Administration, or the George Washington University School of Business. The Fellowship also comes with a stipulation requiring two years of Wolcott Board approved government service, in a non-political government agency.

The Wolcott Foundation, founded in 1960 by Willie Wolcott, has awarded almost 500 Fellowships with many graduates achieving high level government positions including United States Ambassador. Students often find internships or employment in government departments in Washington, DC while completing their graduate studies. Many graduates upon completion of the two year graduate program continue within their current agency or apply for other positions in the many agencies of the federal, state, or local governments.

The Wolcott Foundation currently has seven (7) Wolcott Fellows completing their graduate studies at George Washington University. Two Wolcott Fellows will graduate in June 2019 and five Fellows will complete their first year of study in June.

The names of the six (6) new Wolcott Fellows will be released at the end of March and will appear on the Wolcott Foundation website, www.wolcottfoundation.com at that time.

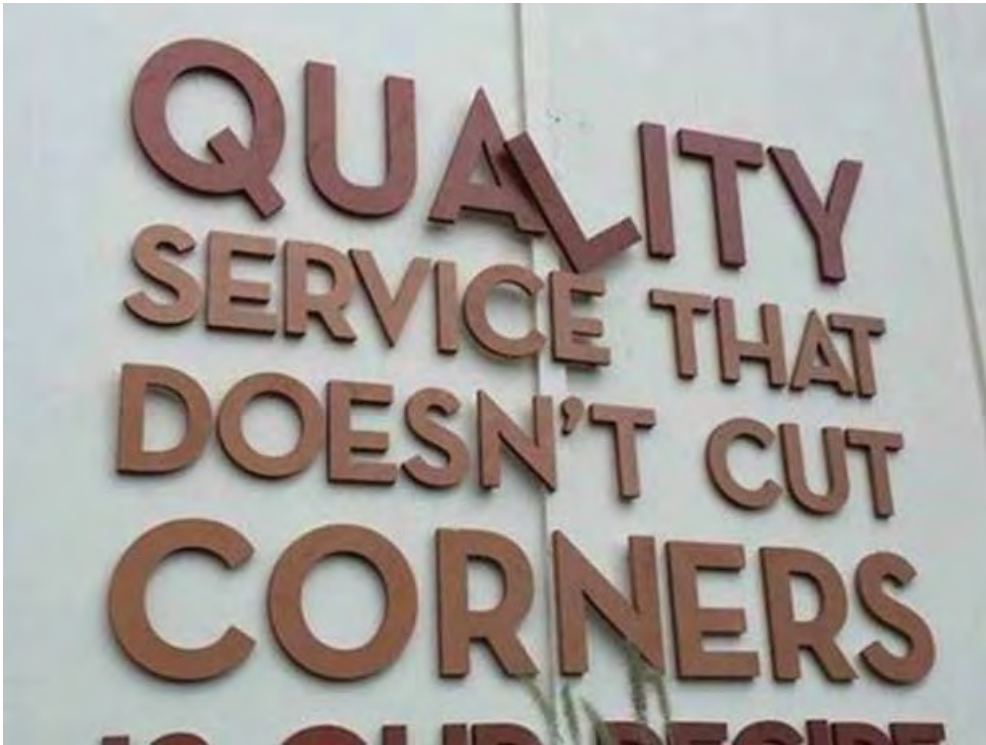
