



Springfield Masonic Community Club #483 was pleased to host members of the Springfield Fire District at our meeting on Tuesday, January 23, 2024, to lead off our new year as part of our Community Interest series of guest speakers. Springfield Fire Division Battalion Chief Jeremy Linn presented information on the Clark County Fire Academy at Clark State College, where he is Director. This educational institution regularly graduates fire fighters who move directly into jobs in local Fire Divisions. The most recent class of six was on full pay while in the Academy and are now full-time fire fighters in the City. Normal classes number about eighteen trainees.

Chief Linn also introduced Cpt Rebecca Anderson, Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and Paramedic, who is the first woman officer in the Springfield Fire Division and the first promoted to Captain. She detailed the city system that qualifies all fire fighters as EMTs and requires them to become paramedics within five years. Both Cpt Anderson and Chief Linn talked positively about the building program in Springfield which will bring four new fire stations online in the next few years. The first will be a joint facility with Clark State College which will serve the city and the college campus and will have embedded office and classrooms for the academy.

On a more somber subject it was noted that our club has lost three WWII veterans in the recent past. Past Club President in 2004, JR “Junior” Nichols, 99, passed away on March 30, 2023. He was a member of the U.S. Army Air Corps and transitioned to the U.S. Air Force from which he ultimately retired. MWB C. Rolland “Rollie” Lattanner, 100, PCP in 2012, passed away November 30, 2023, at a nursing home in Dublin, OH. He was a member of the U.S. Navy in the Pacific in WWII and was recalled to service during the Korean War, where he served in the Mediterranean Sea. Member Edward F. Fischer, 102, passed away on January 15, 2024 at SMC. Brother Fisher was a 70 year member of the Masons at the time of his passing. He was a WWII veteran of the Navy in the Pacific and was promoted to Lieutenant. These members of the Greatest Generation served the nation, their communities and the Masonic Fraternity in many capacities and were outstanding members of our High Twelve Club.
